**<u>Club Update</u>**: The club update from RD and EA included the following:

The recent Junior Open was a successful event with thanks to go to Ali Hall and Jeremy Jenkins. The Ladies' Open was a wonderfully well-organised event with over 100 entries and received a great deal of positive feedback from those taking part.

The upcoming Mixed Open has 82 entries so far.

On course information, the first tee on the Valley course is under construction with a likely opening in May 2025 and the right-hand bunker on the 10<sup>th</sup> hole of the Blyth course is being removed and turfed over with a drop zone in place for balls entering the GUR area being prepared.

The wooden flooring on the terrace is being renewed and the screens for entering competition scores have now been installed in both changing rooms.

On the social front the Tapas night was well supported with 80 tickets being sold and there will be entertainment by an Abba tribute band at the end of August for which tickets are available. The proposed Summer Ball was unfortunately cancelled as the numbers due to attend were insufficient to support the event. We will try again next year with a possible change of date. The 31<sup>st</sup> August will see the Air Ambulance team, plus helicopter, back to the club as a thank you for the wonderful support given to them by the club with a sum close to £250,000 raised since the first Air Ambulance Day. There are many people to thank for this but Gary Slaymaker deserves special credit for his unfailing leadership and commitment to the charity.

On the playing front George Swallow shot a one over par 73 to win the Junior Open in very difficult conditions. He also entered the McGregor Trophy, a prestigious under 16 event with a handicap entry requirement of scratch, played at the West Essex course and attracting an international field. On the first day he shot one over par to finish 17<sup>th</sup> which was a hugely creditable result and although his 2nd day round was not of the same standard it underlies his genuine potential for the future.

Lastly, PK was thanked for his initiative in raising money for the Juniors by asking members to donate unwanted clubs for re-sale. This has been well very supported by members with a total of over £1,500 raised for Junior Funds to date.

With regard to the changes to the 10<sup>th</sup> hole on the Blyth course KPB raised the issue of balls entering the adjacent pond when rolling off the newly turfed area when all the work has been completed and the drop zones not in operation. He wondered if a local rule might be needed as

there would seem to be a problem with where relief would now be taken due to the proximity of the  $1^{st}$  tee.

A final decision on club manager is yet to be decided.

7. **The Golf course** is in great condition and players and guests alike are all offering positive feedback. The continued rain mixed with sunshine has allowed the fairways to remain lush and green, which contributes to the overall feeling of the condition of the course. It is good to see work beginning on the 10<sup>th</sup> to remove the right-hand greenside bunker.

## 8. County Matches update -

- We played our 3<sup>nd</sup> round **Tolly** match away at Thorpeness (where we lost our 2<sup>nd</sup> round match last year) on the 23<sup>rd</sup> June and struggled in the morning session, losing heavily in two matches, but losing all four (18 down). A better afternoon performance saw us only lose the session 1 down, but the damage had already been done. As, arguably, the hardest format in golf, there is a sense that as a club we now know six really strong pairs, who intend to continue to play together.

With the relatively small number of ladies wanting to play competition golf on Sunday this was not expected to cause difficulties and would be a compromise to fairness for all members who pay the same annual subscription for their golf and a progression on a journey to equality for all members.

RD said that he would like to know the dates for major competitions and matches for 2025 from each of the three sections as soon as possible and RS agreed to sit down with PB to review the competition dates to try to establish a better balance throughout the year.

Competition money for June has been received

Payments for County competitions total to date £ 1,857.81 of which £ 429.03 relates to the Parks and Beaumont competitions.

I propose that a transfer be made to a deposit account with immediate access of £8,000.

At the meeting it was agreed that the proposed transfer to a deposit account was in order and that Captain's jumpers for each of the three sections would be paid for from club funds with each section responsible for contributing to this. JM said he would take this proposal to the next Seniors' *Committee Meeting on 13<sup>th</sup> August.* 

KPB said that he was concerned about the excess of funds for the Juniors. RD replied by saying that he would look at the structure of coaching for next year and adapt as finds permitted. With a rapidly growing Junior section he felt that the funds raised for the Juniors could be spent effectively in support of the coaching that he and Alistair were providing. It was agreed that having sufficient funding due to the generosity of the management and members could only be of benefit to the club in the long-term.

# Matters for Discussion:

- (1) The proposal for a County Team Honours Board from PK and PB was briefly discussed with an example of such a board from another Suffolk club having been circulated beforehand. It was generally accepted as an idea that we should pursue and EA said she would talk to Lois Hunt about this as the general layout of the public areas was ultimately a management decision.
- (2) The question of the criteria by which the recipient of the Ben Trophy award would be decided was to taken up at the next meeting. RS had offered some suggestions for this which had been circulated to Committee members but in his absence from the meeting it was decided to postpone the decision until then.

# Health & Safety: Nothing to report

Any Other Business: PB had asked that we should look at the number of charities which the membership is currently supporting. He felt that we were in danger of an overload and would be better to concentrate our efforts on a smaller number. GS was in agreement with this and JM suggested that we should concentrate our efforts on the main charity days that already exist. It was however recognised that it is very difficult to say no to a member who wants to raise money for a particular charity that means something to them and that it was widely acknowledged how generous members were in supporting the range of charities that they do. It was agreed that we needed to be mindful of the proliferation of charities supported and that some difficult decisions would need to be made.
