#### 1. Apologies

## 2. Minutes of the last Meeting

The minutes of the meeting 3<sup>rd</sup> October 2024, were approved and signed by the Secretary – KF.

## 3. Update on previous minutes actions:

## a. Email to Management re the Toilets.

An email to management had been compiled by the Committee on behalf of the ladies committee and section regarding the Toilets. No response had been received to date.

## 4. Competition Secretary report

Competition Secretary submitted a report which was noted. (attached) The monthly Mixed Saturday competitions were discussed. The original idea for Saturdays, as put forward by the Club Captain and management, was that they would encourage men to move to playing from a Sunday and therefore free up places. It was felt that this is unlikely to happen. There was further concern about these competitions being launched in the winter and without consultation with the Ladies Competition secretary.

The Christmas event was discussed, regarding who would sponsor it and whose charity it would benefit. There was some confusion as the date of the AGM had been moved into November. After much discussion it was agreed this year would benefit the Bobby Moore Charity and be sponsored by the Committee and the funds left in CC's account. However, how this works in the future will be reviewed next year when there is more time.

#### 5. Handicap Secretary report

The Handicap Secretary stated that the 1<sup>st</sup> Eclectic Card had been for a Stableford but players had not been reminded to putt out if they were in the Eclectic. IG Eclectic would not accept NR as a result and therefore LK and SH were going to amend the scores for that competition to show a double bogey where an NR had been recorded. This would then allow the card to be accepted by IG but would not amend or uplift any scores.

After discussion, it was agreed that the spells would be a mulligan, a free move away from a hazard and a move to a better putting position. BD to organise. - c) Christmas Lunch The menu prices are £32.50 for 3 courses and £ 27.50 for two. The balances of approximately £393 to be offset and applied as discount for all for the meal.

This month saw a very successful Invitation Day where we raised a further £247 from the raffle for The Bobby Moore Foundation, where the total to date stands at £4592.05. In addition, The Fund Raising Day collected £393 from fees and raffle which will be put to subsidise the sections Xmas lunch.
