### Minutes of the Last Meeting. Accepted as a true record

**Matters Arising:** With reference to the analysis of scores on each hole produced for the Committee by RS for the August meeting the comment was made that it would also be Interesting to see if there was much difference with the r<u>elativ</u>e difficulty of scores per hole in the summer months compared to those in the winter.

Three trophies (Seniors Championship, Juniors Championship and Land Trophy) have been given out and all returned within the stipulated two-week period. SH asked whether they had been signed out and signed back in again and whether there were any potential insurance issues. BT said he would look at the insurance issues and decide whether the holder of the trophy would need to sign that they were responsible for its safe return if it was not covered by our own insurance.

On the question of the Ben Townsend Award it was agreed that it would be appropriate to posthumously award the trophy to the late Eric Felgate. The Committee were in no doubt that he was most deserving of the award and that it was also appropriate for this to happen in the year following his death. In future years the idea put forward at the last Committee Meeting would be followed with the captains of each section putting forward their suggestions to BT and then jointly coming to an agreed decision for the award. With the decision already made for this year's award there was time to modify this idea of selection if that was thought to be necessary.

### Club Update: (from BT)

On the social side the Abba Night had been a success and great fun but there was the likelihood that the upcoming Music Night would need to be postponed due to lack of support. DT is hosting another Quiz Night on 12<sup>th</sup> October and there is good support for this. Posters for Christmas and New Year events are already in evidence.

With autumn now upon us the bar will close either at 6.00 pm or 6.30 pm and the shop at 5.00pm.

On the course the greens have been cored and already they are showing signs of new growth. On the Valley Course the tees have had heavy wear over the summer months and the mats are now in operation to allow the tees to recover. The efforts of the stone-picking volunteers, led by PK, have been much appreciated by Mark and are ongoing at the present time. New GUR signs have now arrived and can be in place wherever they are needed on the course.

The last month easier conditions has brought down several handicaps (although I cannot 100% trust IG as it seems to miss out players and I have no way of finding out who and why)



## Ladies' Treasurer's Report: (Viv Leech)

A total of 6 competitions were played this month with £287.00 being returned from HGC. Of those 6, one, The Medal of Medals was a free competition and another was the Mixed Ping 4 ball better ball from which £35 was collected but all forwarded to England Golf as per the rules. The good news is that Halesworth GC will have representatives at the final with Paul Kent & Rita Fossey playing at Thonock Park on 9<sup>th</sup> September.

The majority of funds, paid out this month (behind only charity payments) were for County expenses (£575.11) mainly as a result of the ladies' sections continued success in The Stearn and Jubilee competitions which is a great thing to see. However this amount also included £270 paid to Suffolk County Ladies for our competitions in 2025, so a 'one off' payment.

On the Charity side, I have paid a further £1169.84 to The Bobby Moore foundation, raised from the raffle at the Ladies Open (£673.49) and balances of the "666" (£81.80) and "55" (£414.55) challenges, making a total of £4019.70 to date.

We continue to see applications for our Spooktacular event in October with another £500 being added to £600 already received and with nearly 3 months to go I expect to see more coming in.

Finally, included in our available balance is the LC funds (now £319.11) so with just under £300 and the balance of £516 in the savings account we are still covering our costs.

- 02.09.24 & 03.09.24 21 members joined me in the stone picking evenings, focusing on the 1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup>, 10<sup>th</sup>, 18<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> holes initially. 13 full buckets of stones were removed across the two evenings. More days are now arranged for 24<sup>th</sup> & 25<sup>th</sup> Sept.
- **09.09.24** I travelled with Rita Fossey to the **Ping National 4BBB** final held at Thonock Park Golf Club on **10.09.24**. Rita & I enjoyed our experience but could not compete with the high handicappers racking up high scores. The winners posted a score of 52 points!

Bob Judd won the day with 35 points, the team event was won by Bob, KPB, Dave King & Gary Slaymaker. The individual Millennium Salver was won by Gary Slaymaker. - I continue to meet with BT on a regular basis to discuss developments around the club.

I have never really wanted to do this calculation but I feel it helps understand the generosity many of us give back to the club so I am suggesting we follow the lead from the Dementia day and for the big charity events **provide a members rate and a visitors rate as an acknowledgement of the support many of the same people give**, I feel in this way we can show we have addressed comments I have heard regarding cost of these events and will continue to get the great support from our members we currently are getting.

### Handicap Secretary's Report :

An Annual Review will need to take place around Mid October.

We currently **have 27 players who have their soft cap enabled** slowing the rate at which their handicap is increasing – **No player has their hard cap enabled** which is not surprising during summer months.

I have attached a document showing all our current players (27) with the cap enabled

In my last report I produced a hole statistics report. In this report I would like to **explain a little about the soft cap.** 

The soft cap is triggered when a players handicap increases quickly over time, it is not an accurate calculation but normally triggers if a players handicap index goes 3 above their low handicap index. The low handicap index is the lowest they have been in the last 12 calendar months and is fluid so moves as dates change.

The soft cap slows the rate at which a players handicap changes by not adjusting to the full amount a new score may give.

As Handicap Secretary I use the soft cap report on a weekly basis to see players moving in or out of it. If a player moves in it is important for the handicap secretary to investigate why – is it just bad form OR is it because there has been an increase in poor general play cards submitted which would give clear evidence of a player they may be trying to manipulate their handicap. If this occurs this would be brought to members of the handicap committee and a decision made as to how to progress with the player concerned.

I would be happy to talk this through with you at the next meeting as a numerical example is often easier to understand.

Why do we need this money?

We have expenses at the yearend for the AGM, Captain's sweater etc. say £1000

We have to pay for the cost of County Competitions. Each home draw brings a cost of £250, but each away draw £500 and this is for 4 competitions and for each round of them. You may remember we seemed to be drawn away a lot – that would mean £4,000 if we reach round 2 in each of them. That we swallow up our balance.

How do we adjust the balance, whether we have too much or too little. This is done by adjusting the payouts on the competitions. Last year the payout was about 78%, but this year it is 83%, a higher percentage, but part of this is from increased participation rather than increased payout amounts.

If there are projects to be paid for (it was suggested to me that funds could be used for a seat for 4 players, with cover over like a bus stop, placed by the 5<sup>th</sup> teebox), then the payout can be adjusted to account for it.

- To set a criterion for any new trophy consideration. Agreed Sept 24 PK to share with BT draft for consideration.
- To review and update all current documents and name and date stamp each one. **Agreed Sept 24** – Each section to update its relevant policies and date accordingly.
- To review any perceived barriers for joining committees. Outstanding item Agreed Sept 24 that we will keep current process for this year but review in committee in 2025.

## 3. Competitions

- To align each sections financial process so that we have commonality and transparency across the club. **Outstanding item**.
- To review the clubs use of IG generally in March 24 meeting. **Outstanding item Agreed Sept 2024** to use future committee meeting to review how we use IG as a club.

It was agreed that this question would be re-visited at the next Committee Meeting and a decision made so that notices could be posted on the boards and on iG to inform members.

Senior and Gents reps just need to liaise with EA in order to get the correct photo in the correct place on IG so that all associated trophies and competitions can be seen by all.

JM felt that the share of the engraving costs by the Seniors needs to be discussed with KPB together with the Seniors share towards the expenses for the Parks and Beaumont teams. DW said that he would try to locate any relevant information from earlier Committee Meetings related to this and it was agreed that the funding of Gents County Competitions would need to be looked at and updated if necessary at a future date.
