9. Review of Divisions

It was agreed to move to three divisions from March to October for the qualifying competitions. There will be prizes awarded to the first and second players in each division. In the winter months, this will revert to two divisions. This will be explained at the AGM.

VL expressed concern over the amount of income being generated for the club, particularly in the light of expenses due to the success in County Competitions. It was agreed that the committee would consider ways to raise additional income and discuss at the next meeting.

10. Player of the Year

KF explained how she currently maintains a giant spreadsheet to determine the Player of the Year. There is a facility in IG, which the men and the seniors use. This, however, would not include points for putting competitions, eclectics and knockouts and also when a trophy was played as part of a medal or stableford. These all require manual entry.

The spreadsheet takes many hours to maintain. Consequently, it was agreed that the section should move to the IG system, which would mean that all qualifying competitions and specific trophy competitions are included but not the adhoc items listed above. This will be put to the AGM.

11. Purchase of equipment.

It was agreed to continue using the Club equipment for nearest the pin and similar.

It was also agreed to approach Jay Oldknow to ask if we could replace the Glasses awarded to the winner for the Jay Oldknow trophy with a cash prize, so as to bring it in line with the rest of the mixed competitions.

Committee meeting Thursday 3rd October

A busy month with the final 2 Weston matches, the quarter final of the Stearn at Gorleston and the semi final of the Silver Jubilee Cup at Fynn Valley taking place. The success of the latter two competitions has obviously increased the sections outgoings this year.

With this in mind, I have therefore transferred the majority of the balance (£500) sitting in the Business Premium account to cover these and any further unforeseen outgoings, should we continue to be successful, leaving a nominal amount of £16.53 to keep the account open.
